

Chapter 17

HOW, WHILE SAINT FRANCIS WAS PRAYING AT NIGHT, A YOUNG BROTHER, A BOY, SAW CHRIST AND THE VIRGIN MARY AND MANY OTHER SAINTS TALK WITH HIM

A boy who was very pure and innocent was received into the Order while Saint Francis was living; and he was staying in a small place where the brothers, out of necessity, slept outside on the ground. Saint Francis once came to this place and in the evening after saying compline, he went off to sleep as he usually did, so could get up at night to pray when the other brothers were asleep. The boy had in mind to spy attentively on Saint Francis's movements in order to find out about his holiness and especially to know what the saint did at night when he arose. To make sure that sleep would not overcome him, he lay down to sleep at Saint Francis's side and tied his cord to that of Saint Francis, so he would feel when the saint arose. And Saint Francis did not feel

any of this. That night, during the first time of sleep, when all the other brothers were sleeping, St. Francis got up and found his cord tied that way. He gently untied it so that the boy did not feel it, and Saint Francis went alone into the woods near the place, entering a little cell there and set himself to pray. The boy awoke after a while and found the cord untied and Saint Francis gone, so he got up to look for him. When he found the gate to the woods open, he thought that Saint Francis had gone out there, so he entered the woods. Reaching the place where Saint Francis was praying, he began to hear a great sound of voices. Going closer so that he might see and understand what he heard, he saw a wonderful light surrounding Saint Francis on all sides, and in it he saw Christ and the Virgin Mary and Saint John the Baptist and the Evangelist and a great multitude of angels speaking with Saint Francis. When the boy saw and heard this, he fell to the ground as if dead. Then, when the mystery of that holy apparition ended, Saint Francis was returning to the place. And his foot bumped into the boy lying almost dead on the path. Out of compassion, he lifted him up, took him in his arms and carried him back, as a good shepherd does with his little sheep.

Learning from him later about how he saw the vision, he ordered him never to tell anyone, that is, while he lived. The boy, growing in the grace of God and devotion to Saint Francis, was an important man in the Order, and, after the death of Saint Francis, he revealed that vision to the brothers.

God has a plan for each of our lives! Our life is like a "tapestry" in which God helps us "weave in and out in this life". In my life, I started to see God weave His tapestry!

I heard the Holy Spirit's voice a couple of years ago when a close friend invited me to a <u>Walking with Purpose</u> bible class at our Lady of the Fields Catholic Church in Millersville, MD. As I sat in the first bible class, I felt the power of the Holy Spirit overwhelm me! At that moment, I knew I was in the right place; however, that was not the only thing overwhelming me! The Holy Spirit asked me to invite another woman to the bible class. My response was, "Humm, I don't think so. I don't know her that well, and she is going to ask me too many questions."

The Holy Spirit would not give up in the request because when God has a plan, He will direct you in toward that path! In obedience, and to avoid a conversation with the woman, I was guided by the Holy Spirit to email the woman and invite her to the bible class. The woman immediately responded to the email, and she was at the next class. The woman's name was **Nora Morris!** That year, my close friend, Nora, and I, completed the bible class. The following year my close friend started <u>Walking with Purpose</u> at Holy Family; however, Nora and I stayed at Our Lady of the Fields. We became close friends, and in a way, sisters! Many things transpired in our relationship; it was a roller coaster ride to say the least!


After completing the second year at Our Lady of the Fields, Nora and I returned to Holy Family. Nora was volunteering for every ministry because she wanted to know God better. When I look back, I can see God was preparing us for a battle!

That same year, turmoil overcame Holy Family. Our priest was under attack by some parishioners and the rest of us did not know what to do or how to protect him, but God had a plan! Nora, I, and other

parishioners began praying and uniting ourselves to try to let go of our emotions and listen to the Holy Spirit. The message was: "Defend your church, be warriors!" During that time of turmoil, I wrote weekly, maybe daily, emails to a group of emails given to me by other parishioners. People wanted to know how we were to keep our church solid and our priest in place. I prayed over every email and only listened to the Holy Spirit as I read scripture and the catechism. I had to stay grounded in the Word. After months of distributing information via email to the parishioners, praying in community, having weekly meetings, and writing daily letters to the Archdiocese, our church and priest survived the storm! Our priest returned to the parish, and the community rejoiced!

A few weeks after our priest's arrival, Nora met me at the Chapel to tell me she had pancreatic cancer! My world stopped! Really, Lord? I looked at Jesus crucified and tried so hard not to cry and be stoic. I heard the Holy Spirit say, "You need to write to the community and invite them to pray." Again, I said, "I don't think so!" Nora was a very private person! Besides her father having passed away, her mom living in Florida, and her immediate family, I knew little about her. However, I told Nora what the Holy Spirit asked, and she resisted. I told her it was not her decision! Holy Family's journey of prayer, faith, hope, and love began all over again. Holy Family was stronger and more united than ever! Nevertheless, Nora died a year and a half later after our priest's return. All our friends saw the "tapestry" God had woven on one of our dear one's life. God was helping Nora focus on Him!

I continued to write for three years after Nora's death. I wrote about her influence in the life of Holy Family's community, Walking with Purpose's women group, and those she touched with her life on earth's journey. As many times as I look back at that first email I wrote inviting Nora to the bible class, I see that God wanted Nora to be in a more intimate relationship with Him as she suffered through the cancer and began to leave her family in the world! Our priest's spiritual journey and Nora's suffering showed me God's mercy. God taught me to listen and obey. God also wanted me to teach people to pray, and so began the Holy Hour Ministry. In addition, the emails are to inspire people to come closer to Him. The Holy Spirit inspires me to move, move, move! I do so through spiritual guidance, prayer, and confession because I know God is still "weaving my tapestry" and I want it to be "beautiful"!
